Bufs Looking For Lucky No. 21

QUICKLY

The 69th NCAA Ski Championships are set for March 9-12 in Utah, with alpine events taking place at Park City Mountain Resort in Park City, Utah, and Nordic events happening at Soldier Hollow Resort in Midway, Utah ... This is the seventh time the state of Utah and the University of Utah has served as host, with Park City and SoHo serving as the championship site for the fifth time ... The pandemic's effects on the sporting world are approaching the two-year mark, as the 2020 NCAA Ski Championships were canceled shortly after competition wrapped up on the second day on March 11, 2020 ... The Buffaloes have won 20 national championships in skiing: 11 men's (1959-60-72-73-74-75-76-77-78-79-82), one women's (1982 AIAW) and eight coed (1991-95-98-99-2006-11-13-15) ... Since 2006, CU has finished first (2006-11-13-15) or second (2008-09-10-17-18-21) in 11 of the 15 championships (third in '07, '12 and '19; fourth in '14) ... CU is the only school nationally to finish in the top four in each of the last 15 championships ... The skiers are gunning for CU's 30th overall National Championship, CU has won five in men's cross country (2002, '04, '06, '13, '14) three in women's cross country (2000, '04, '18) and one in football (1991) ... CU has finished in the top three in 93 of its last 99 ski meets and the Buffs have finished first or second in 66 of their last 85 times out (31 wins) ... Of CU's 20 ski titles, 10 have been won in the west and 10 in the east ... St. Lawrence will host at Lake Placid in 2023 with the Buffs back on deck to host at Steamboat Springs in 2024. Dartmouth will host in 2025 and Montana State in 2026.

A CLOSER LOOK AT THE NCAAs

The 2022 NCAA Championships will feature 22 teams, back from a dip in 2021 to 17 teams due to the pandemic ... With that return to normal, fewer teams will feature a full 12-skier team at these championships, after eight did so in 2021 ... In 2022, the Buffs are one of just five teams with a full squad alongside Dartmouth, Denver, New Hampshire and Utah ... Four other schools that host either alpine or Nordic only are also here with full squads with Alaska Fairbanks, Michigan Tech, Northern Michigan and Westminster filling that bill ... Middlebury and New Hampshire are both one skier short with 11 in attendance and Alaska Anchorage comes to Utah with 10 skiers ... Utah has won three of the last four titles and 12 since skiing went coed in 1983, most in the nation ... The Utes were dominant in the RMISA regular season, winning all but one meet through the regular season and enter the NCAAs as the champions of the RMISA ... The east region, which returns Dartmouth and Middlebury after both schools didn't compete in 2021 ... Vermont has been as dominant in the east as Utah is in the west, winning all five regular season meets and the EISA Championships ... Dartmouth has finished twice four times with Middlebury and New Hampshire also finishing in the second spot throughout the season ... In the central region, Michigan Tech had the upper hand in the women's rankings and Northern Michigan on the men's as those two traditional powers account for 12 of the 17 skiers at the championship from the central region ... In 2006, CU became the first school to win the NCAA title without a full 12-skier team, participating minus one men's alpine skier, and in 2008, Denver won the title being down a women's Nordic skier – these are the only two times a team without a full roster has won ... The leader at the midway point has claimed 13 of the last 19, while schools leading after three days (or six events) have won 21 of the last 25 times (though Utah rallied from 34½ points behind Denver to win the 2017 crown) ... The last three teams to lead from wire-to-wire were Denver (2002, 2010) and CU (2011). In 2013 Vermont lead each of the first three days and the Buffs pulled off the largest comeback in history, overcoming a 53-point deficit on the final day to secure the school's 19th championship.

- – Colorado placed nine skiers on the All-RMISA teams, including three on the first team.
- – Filip Forejtek repeated as the RMISA Men's GS MVP and is the only men's alpine skier in the top seed in both GS and slalom from the RMISA at the Championships.
- – The 12 skiers representing the Buffs have 67 top 10 finishes this season with 19 podium appearances and 10 race victories.
- – In their careers, these 12 skiers have 150 top 10 finishes with 50 podium appearances and 17 race wins, with nine of the 12 having a podium appearance and two winning a race.
- – Boee and Forejtek are both climbing the impressive CU career charts for wins, podiums and top five performances.

LEROY ERA BEGINS AT COLORADO

After the 2021 season, legendary coach Richard Rokos retired after 31 seasons as the head coach and 35 seasons as part of the CU ski program. The 2022 season is actually the 36th that Rokos has been a part of the program, serving as a volunteer coach under the direction of new head coach Andy LeRoy. Between the two, they have won 14 NCAA Championships as Rokos retired with eight in his time at CU and LeRoy, who skied for Rokos in college, comes to CU with six championships in his 15 seasons at Denver. Since LeRoy began at DU, the two have won nine of the last 15 championships. LeRoy also has three RMISA Championships and has coached 46 individual NCAA Champions and 166 All-Americans in his time at DU. His alpine teams have had the most points at the NCAA Championships 11 of out his 15 seasons as a coach.

ROKOS THE STUFF OF LEGENDS

The Richard Rokos coaching tree and impact on the college skiing world cannot be overstated and goes well beyond his collegiate coaching tree. But when specifically talking about his assistant coaches that have gone on to coach elsewhere, either himself or his coaching tree is responsible for 11 of the last 13 NCAA Championships dating back to 2008, with current CU coach Andy LeRoy accounting for six of those 11. Rokos himself has three in that span and the other two have come from Fredrik Landstedt, 2019 and '21 for Utah. Landstedt was the Nordic coach for Rokos from 1995-97, his first college coaching job. Rokos final numbers were astonishing and include eight NCAA Championships, 20 RMISA Championships, 73 meet wins, 66 individual Regional Champions, 46 individual NCAA Champions, 364 race wins, 290 All-Americans and a dual record of 1,547-185.

TRADITIONAL FAVORITES

Colorado (26 top two finishes, with 17 wins), Utah (25; 13 titles), Vermont (23; six titles) and Denver (20; 14 wins) have dominated NCAA college skiing over the past 54 seasons (dating back to 1967). Only three other schools, Wyoming (one win and four seconds), New Mexico (one crown and two runner-ups) and Dartmouth (two titles) and have been able to crack the top two in this span, and two of those three no longer support skiing as an NCAA sport. Since 1990, Denver has won nine titles, CU eight, Utah eight and Vermont four; the only three other schools that have won a title since the sport went coed (in 1983) are Wyoming (1985), New Mexico (2004) and Dartmouth (2007). Middlebury (1980, women) is the last school to win other than the aforementioned seven. Dartmouth snapped a 12-year reign by western schools with its win in 2007 and UVM returned to the top in 2012, but the west still has 24 of the last 26 titles and 32 of 38 coed crowns dating back to 1983.

PARTICIPANTS

A total of 22 schools will be represented in Steamboat (*—qualified full 12-skier roster):

Alaska-Anchorage, Alaska-Fairbanks, Boston College, Bowdoin, Colby, *Colorado, *Dartmouth, *Denver, Green Bay, Harvard, Michigan Tech, Middlebury, Montana State, New Hampshire, Northern Michigan, Plymouth State, St. Lawrence, St. Michael's, St. Scholastica, *Utah, *Vermont and Westminster. Five schools qualified the maximum of 12 skiers overall and four more qualified a full allotment of six only competing in one discipline: Alaska Fairbanks (Nordic), Michigan Tech (Nordic), Northern Michigan (Nordic) and Westminster (alpine).

SCORING FORMAT

This is the ninth season of the most recent scoring format for the NCAA Championships, which the RMISA adopts for its regular season meets. After five years of a 50-point scoring base, the scoring base reverted back to 40 points in 2014 (39 was the norm from 1997-2008, 50 from 2009-2013), one that is weighted toward the top seven finishers; points are awarded on a 40-37-34-31-29-27-25-23-22-21-20-19-18-17-16-15-14-13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis for 30 finishing positions.

THE SCHEDULE

The GIANT SLALOM races will open the NCAA Championships on Wednesday, March 9, with the women's first run tentatively set for 9:30 a.m. MT followed by the men's first run at 10:45 a.m. Second runs are set for 12:45 p.m. (women's) and 2 p.m. (men's). The CLASSIC races will open the Nordic events on Thursday, March 10, with the men's 10K race set for 10 a.m. and the women's 5K race for 12 p.m. The SLALOM races will take place Friday, March 11, beginning with the men's first run at 9:30 a.m. and the women's first run at 10:30 a.m., with second runs set for 12:30 p.m. (men's) and 1:30 p.m. (women's). The FREESTYLE races will close out the NCAA meet on Saturday, March 12, with the women's 15K race set for 10 a.m. and the men's 20K at 12 p.m.

HISTORICALLY

The NCAA first sponsored a men's national championship in skiing in 1954, though national title meets (National Intercollegiate Championships) began in 1950. Women's programs came into being in the late 1970s, with then-CU head coach Bill Marolt at the forefront of making it a reality. CU has competed in all but three of the previous 65 NCAA's, but on one of those occasions (1964), several team members had trained for and competed in the Winter Olympics, and in 1967, sent only a few skiers as individuals to Maine for financial reasons. The AIAW sponsored women's titles between 1977 and 1982; in 1983, the NCAA absorbed the AIAW but combined male and female competition, as was the case in rifle and fencing.

BOEE MARCHES ON

Junior Magnus Boee is having another outstanding season, although not quite up to the season he put together his sophomore season, during which he won 10 of 12 races including two individual Regional and two individual NCAA Championships. Still, he's atop the NCAA Qualification list in the RMISA for the second straight season. Entering NCAA's, he has finished all 10 races in the top 10 with a high finish of seventh, and has eight top five finishes, six podium appearances and one race victory, moving his career total to 14 race wins, tied for fifth most in the storied program history. He also ranks 10th in career podium appearances with 22 and 12th in career top five finishes with 27. He's headed to NCAA's with three straight runner up finishes, including the last race in the Alaska series and both races at the RMISA Championships.

FOREJTEK'S FOUR ISN'T ENOUGH

In a four-year career that includes runner-up finishes in both the slalom and GS races at the NCAA Championships, the season Filip Forejtek put together in 2022 may be his best. After winning one race of his first 34 starts in college entering the 2022 season, he has two wins this season, one in each discipline. He won the season opening GS race at the Montana State Invitational and then followed up with a slalom win at the Utah Invitational on the same mountain as this week's NCAA Championships. In Utah, he also finished second in the GS race. In his career, he now has 17 podium appearances, 24 top five finishes and 28 top 10 finishes. His 17 podiums ranks tied for 15th in CU history while his 24 top fives ranks tied for 17th in the CU record book. In terms of men's alpine, his 24 top fives ranks second behind Frank Brown's total of 27, while his 17 podiums ranks fourth most in CU history. He is planning to come back for his super senior season in 2023.

HARSCH'S FAIRY TALE ENDING

Kaitlyn Harsch has put a fairy tale ending on her final season as a Colorado Buffalo. Coming into CU younger than most freshmen skiers straight out of high school, she has shown flashes throughout her career, but her consistent skiing to close out her career has made her a legit All-American threat in her final races. Entering her senior season, she had two top 10 finishes in 16 career slalom races. And outside those two top 10's, which were a sixth and 10th place, her best finish was 13th multiple times. This season in slalom alone, she had her second best finish of eighth at the Utah Invitational, the same hill at Park City that the NCAA Championships will be skied upon, and she has finished 12th, 13th and 13th in the other three slalom races, her fourth, fifth and sixth best finishes in her career. At the RMISA Championships in the slalom race, she had the second-fastest second run in the field to move up from 22nd to 13th after the first run. She also took fifth in the parallel slalom, her third top five to go along with two podiums in the event this season.

HAMMERGAARD SHATTERING CAREER BEST FINISHES

In her first two-and-a-half seasons, junior Emma Hamnergaard established herself as a consistent skier, picking up three top 10s in her freshman season and adding five more as a sophomore. Her lucky number seemed to be eight. Her career best in both disciplines was eighth place and of those first eight top 10s, six were in eighth place. She opened her junior season with similar results, picking up four top 10s in her first five finished races, including her seventh and eighth, eighth-place finish. Then in the five days of racing that concluded the DU Invitational and encompassed the RMISA Championships, she finally broke through, in a huge way. She finished sixth on Feb. 21 in the DU Invitational slalom race, then hit the podium for the first time taking second in the GS race at the RMISA Championships. Two days later in the extra slalom qualifier, she took seventh, her third finish inside the top eight in the last four races after eighth being her best finish over her first 33 career races. To put a cap on a solid week at Steamboat Springs, she won the parallel slalom exhibition on Saturday after the conclusion of the RMISA Championships.

DILLING'S SOLID FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN

Freshman Jacob Dilling has made his mark on the RMISA his freshman campaign, putting down one of the most consistent seasons in recent memory for CU. He has finished all 12 races his freshman season all in the top 15. Just two have come outside the top 10, where he was a mainstay for the Buffs all season. He finished with three top five finishes and hit the podium for the first time with a second place GS finish at the DU Invitational. He three times had the fastest run in the field, twice in slalom races and once in a GS.

FAUSA A THREAT IN ANY RACE

Sophomore Louis Fausa hasn't been quite as consistent as freshman Jacob Dilling, but the second half of the 2022 season he certainly reached into the same bag of tricks Dilling has all season. After having one DQ and DNF in his first four races, Fausa has finished five of the last six since Feb. 17 and has finished in the top 10 in all five races. He also had two top five finishes, one in GS and one in slalom, and hit the podium for the first time with a third place finish in the slalom qualifier after the RMISA Championships at Steamboat Springs. He has now finished 16 of 22 races in his career with 12 top 10s, four top fives and one podium.

LUCZAK'S WILD SEASON ENDS AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Freshman Magdalena Luczak certainly has had a wild freshman season that in the end saw her race in just three RMISA races throughout the season, all coming at Steamboat Springs last week at the RMISA Championships. She successfully petitioned the NCAA Ski Committee to compete at the Championships after not fulfilling the minimum four race starts. The original plan was for her to race in the MSU/Utah series and pick up six race starts before heading back to Europe for where she had been competing on the World Cup and successfully qualifying for the XXIV Winter Olympic Games. But she came down with COVID and couldn't return to the United States. She then attempted to cut short her Olympic stay after the GS and slalom races in the first four days of the games, but then her teammate got COVID and she needed to stay and compete in the mixed team parallel event that was postponed until Feb. 20, the final day of competition in the Olympics. Three short days later she had traveled from China through Poland and back to Denver to compete at the RMISA Championships, where she made her collegiate debut taking fifth place in the GS race. After falling just two gates short of the finish line in her first slalom race the next day, she was able to finish seventh in the extra qualifier Friday in Steamboat.

KALETA MAKES RARE COLLEGE-OLYMPIC-U23 WORLDS-NCAA CHAMPS SWING

Freshman Magdalena Luczak wasn't the only Buff from Poland making waves internationally in 2022. Sophomore Weronika Kaleta began her season on the college circuit picking up four race starts to open the season. She left the Buffs straight from the Montana State meet and met up with her National Team to make an Olympic push that was successful. She competed in two XXIV Winter Olympic events, and then traveled with team Poland to Norway for the U23 and Junior World Championships, where she met up with her sister and two American teammates - Alexander Maurer and Will Koch, to compete in those championships, which took place the same week at the RMISA Championships. She then headed back to the US to train for a week ahead of the NCAA Championships next week.

KOCH PICKS UP BRONZE AT WORLD JUNIORS

Sophomore Will Koch took a decided leap forward in his skiing as a sophomore. Not that his freshman season was sub par by any means, when he had four top 10 performances, including a seventh place in the classic race at NCAA Championships to earn second-team All-America honors. But this season, he has finished in the top 10 in all seven races he's competed, which included three top five finishes and two podium appearances, all coming over three races in Alaska in early February. He then represented the United States at the Junior World Championships, where he continued his podium ways, anchoring the 4x5K relay team that finished third and picked up a bronze medal. Koch competed in two other races where he was the top American finisher.

NOT-SO-YOUNG CAPS STELLAR CAREER

Super senior Joey Young will leave CU with a list of accomplishments that can rival any skier in CU history. Taking advantage of the extra season of eligibility afford by the NCAA due to the pandemic in 2020, he is the first skier since skiers stopped competed in both alpine and Nordic events to start 60 career races. The only known skier to rival that mark was Frank Brown, who taking out skimeister, alpine combined and Nordic combined results that weren't new races but calculated via other races, had 60 race starts in downhill, slalom, cross country and jumping from 1957-59. Counting those three areas, Brown had 81 official results in those three seasons. But since the 1966 season, no CU skiers have competed in both and having 60 race starts would've been nearly impossible. The next closest alpine skiers to 60 starts is 56 from Andreas Haug, who skied in 14 races four straight seasons. Thea Gros vold (2013-16) and Nora Christiansen (2016-19) matched the feat in women's alpine racing.

TEAM NOTES

One Sentence Each To Sum Up The Buffs Four Teams:

Men's Alpine: The Buffs have three threats to finish either race with All-American honors in Dilling, Fausa and Forejtek.

Women's Alpine: Hamnergaard and Harsch are both skiing the best of their careers and Luczak is a threat in both races.

Men's Nordic: Boee is arguably the best racer in the west, Koch has hit another level and Nilsen got better each race.

CU At The NCAA Championships (1954-1982)

The NCAA first sponsored a men's national championship in skiing in 1954, though national title meets (National Intercollegiate Championships) were held as early as 1946, the same year CU's program began. Women's programs came into being in the late 1970s, with then CU head coach and eventual AD Bill Marolt at the forefront of making it a reality. CU has competed in each of the last 41 NCAA Championships and in 52 of 55 overall. One of those three occasions where CU didn't qualify (1964), several team members had competed in the Winter Olympics, and in 1967, CU sent only a few skiers to Maine for financial reasons. The old AIAW sponsored women's titles between 1977-82; in 1983, the NCAA absorbed the AIAW but combined the men's and women's competition, as was the case in rifle and fencing. Here's an in-depth look at the NCAA Championship history of the Buffaloes.

NCAA Championship Day-by-Day Leaders Since 1991

The latest scoring format was adopted in 2014, where a maximum 30 skiers can score for their teams. The weighted 40-point base still rewards the top eight skiers in the field with varying additional points over the skier behind them. Scoring is as follows: 40-37-34-31-29-27-25-23-22-21-20-19-18-17-16-15-14-13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1; the west has used this format the last three years, the east still uses the old 50-point format that allowed 39 skiers to score for their teams. Unlike from 1997-2009, no scores are thrown out for those teams that qualified a full 12-skier team or one shy with 11; so to tabulate the final standings, all scores have counted since 2010. The 2020 Championship was cancelled after Day Two due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Here's a day-by-day look at the NCAA Championships since 1991, also charting where the eventual winner was after each day (assorted scoring formats):
