Utes Set to Host 2022 NCAA Ski

Championships

In search of the program's 15th national championship (14th NCAA title) all-time, the Utah ski team is closing in on the 2022 NCAA Ski Championships, which the Utes will host from March 9-12. Utah has won the last two completed NCAA Championships (2019, '21), and was leading at the time the 2020 event was cancelled due to COVID-19.

It marks the first time the NCAA Championships have come through Utah since 2014.

Utah qualified the NCAA maximum of 12 skiers this year with three for each gender in both alpine and Nordic competition. The Utes are one of five programs in the country to qualify the maximum 12 athletes. Other teams at that total include Denver and Colorado out of the RMISA, plus Dartmouth and Vermont.

Utah boasts the most experienced group of athletes among all teams at the NCAA Championships, as 11 of the 12 Utes racing have been on this stage before and combine for 15 All-American accolades. Freshman Kaja Norbye will make her NCAA Championships debut on the alpine side.

To date, it's been another year marked by great success for the Utes, the RMISA regular season champions (2,786 points). Sydney Palmer-Leger was named RMISA Most Valuable Skier both in women's classic and freestyle, plus Wilhelm Normannseth was tabbed Most Valuable Skier in men's slalom. The buildup to the NCAA Championships was capped by NCAA West Regional Individual titles for Novie McCabe (women's CL/FS) and Luke Jager (men's FS). Jager's result also stood as his first college victory.

Utah won all but one meet during the 2022 regular season. The triumphs were highlighted in part by a dominant victory at the Montana State Invitational, which saw the Utes amass 760 points in the team standings, a whopping 253.5 points ahead of the host Bobcats in second place. It was the largest margin of victory in an RMISA meet, smashing the previous record by 73.5 points. The Utes swept both women's Nordic podiums in that meet, the first such feat by a team in an RMISA meet since 2013.

Four Utah qualifiers were in action during the 2022 Winter Olympics in Beijing: Katie Parker (Australia; alpine), Luke Jager (USA; cross-country); Sophia Laukli (USA; cross-country) and Novie McCabe (USA; cross-country). Ten total NCAA Championships participants were in Beijing, representing Colorado (2), Alaska Anchorage, Alaska Fairbanks, Denver and Vermont.

All told, Utah had 12 current and former student-athletes named Olympians, half of whom are currently on the active roster. Across the entire University of Utah, there were 38 athletes with a tie to campus, more than any university in the world. Two more Utes in action for NCAAs—Samuel Hendry and Sydney Palmer-Leger—traveled to Lygna, Norway in February for the FIS Junior/U23 World Championships.

Quick Hits: Women's Nordic

• Undoubtedly one of the greatest storylines heading into the NCAA Championships is that of Sydney Palmer-Leger, the Park City, Utah, native and two-time individual NCAA champion (classic and freestyle) in 2021. Palmer-Leger, top-seeded by the NCAA in both Nordic disciplines, was named RMISA Most Valuable Skier in both classic and freestyle. She has hit the podium in all eight of her college races this year, with six wins. She was named 2021 National Nordic Skier of the Year and also was among the Utes in Lygna, Norway in February for the FIS Junior World Championships.

• Novie McCabe is a few weeks back into the college circuit, fresh off representing Team USA at the Olympics. Although only racing in four college events in 2022, she has won three and took silver in the other—the 5K freestyle at the Montana State Invitational. McCabe won the NCAA West Regional Individual Championship in both classic and freestyle. She was named All-RMISA First Team.

• Fellow Olympian Sophia Laukli, winding down her first season as a Ute, has also been limited to four college races. But Laukli has nevertheless starred in those four events, winning the 5K freestyle and taking bronze in the 10K classic at the MSU Invitational, then claiming silver in both 5K classic and 15K freestyle at the RMISA Championships. Laukli also earned All-RMISA First Team laurels and was tabbed Skier of the Meet for the RMISA Championships.

Quick Hits: Men's Nordic

• Like the trio of women's Nordic qualifiers for Utah, there has been plenty of international racing in the last month for the men as well. Luke Jager repped Team USA at the Winter Olympics, and Samuel Hendry was in Lygna, Norway with Team Canada for the 2022 FIS U23 World Championships.

• Jager, an Alaska native, earned his first collegiate victory on Feb. 26 in the 20K freestyle at the RMISA Championships, doubling as the NCAA West Regional. He was ultimately named RMISA Skier of the Meet and All-RMISA First Team as well. The 2021 All-American honoree owns two other top-five results this season on the college circuit.

• Hendry is a three-time All-American and skied to the podium at NCAAs in 2021, both in the 20K freestyle (2nd) and 10K classic (3rd). He's finished top-10 four times of his five college races this season, with back-to-back podiums at the Montana State Invitational.

• Bjørn Riksaasen rounds out the Nordic men's lineup, twice tabbed All-America in 2021. Riksaasen earned All-RMISA Second Team this season and hit the podium at the RMISA Championships, taking third in the 20K freestyle.

Quick Hits: Men's Alpine

 All-RMISA selection Joachim Lien has finished in the top-10 in eight of his last nine races.
 He won the RMISA giant slalom qualifier in February, though this was not part of team scoring as the race was not part of a meet.
 Lien also tabbed silver in giant slalom at the RMISA Invitational.

 Normannseth, the RMISA men's slalom Most Valuable Skier, has four straight top-five performances, bookended by slalom wins at the Denver Invitational in addition to the RMISA alpine qualifier in February. He has placed no lower than ninth in 10 of his 11 finishes on the season, with an additional podium coming at the Montana State Invitational (silver).

• Gustav Vøllo picked up All-RMISA Honorable Mention with eight top-10 races during the 2022 season. His two best giant slalom results of the year came at Park City, the Utes' home hill and host of the NCAA Championships. Vøllo took fifth in the RMISA Invitational in January, then moved up to fourth the following day during the Utah Invitational.

Quick Hits: Women's Alpine • Sona Moravcikova will race in the NCAA Championships for the fourth time, including third as a Ute (2020, '21). Moravcikova previously skied at New Mexico and qualified for the 2019 NCAA Championships. She owns four top-fives this year, two each in slalom and GS. She was named All-RMISA Honorable Mention as well as Skier of the Meet for the Denver Invitational.

• Making her NCAA Championships debut, Kaja Norbye will be capping an outstanding freshman season with the Utes. The Oslo, Norway native has hit four podiums among her 10 finishes in 2022, all four in giant slalom. The Skier of the Meet for the RMISA Championships took silver in GS at the RMISA Invitational, and also owns three third-place finishes.

• Melbourne, Australia native Katie Parker produced some remarkable college results, even in missing part of the season due to the Winter Olympics. She won the slalom at the Montana State Invitational, after which Parker was named Skier of the Meet. At the Olympics Parker competed in slalom but did not finish. She was named All-RMISA Second Team.

Utah Records At A Glance

 Utah has 13 NCAA Championships, which ranks third all-time behind Denver (24) and Colorado (19). The Utes also won an AIAW title in 1978, bringing their total to 14.
 Utah's 78 individual national

championships ranks third all-time.

• Marvin Melville won three individual titles in 1959 – downhill, slalom and Alpine. The three titles in one year ties for the most in NCAA history.

• Four Utes combined to win five individual titles in 1995, still the NCAA record for most individual championships by one school in a season. Harvard Solbakken (10-km freestyle), Heidi Selnes (5-km freestyle and 15-km classical) Thomas Weman (20-km classical), and Christl Hager (giant slalom) all won titles for Utah that season.

• Christl Hager is the only three-time repeat champion in Utah history, which also ties the national record. She won the giant slalom in 1994, 1995 and 1997.
